DOT Discretionary Grants Dashboard

The <u>DOT Discretionary Grants Dashboard</u> provides communities with an overview of discretionary grant opportunities that can help meet their transportation infrastructure needs.

The Dashboard also includes Federal grant programs outside of DOT that may be of particular interest to <u>rural communities</u>. The <u>Rural Opportunities to Use Transportation for Economic</u> <u>Success (ROUTES)</u> Initiative and an updated <u>Rural Grant</u> <u>Applicant Toolkit</u> was recently published to help rural communities harness the Dashboard. The Dashboard is updated weekly.




Other Resources-FHWA Competitive Grant Funding Matrix
