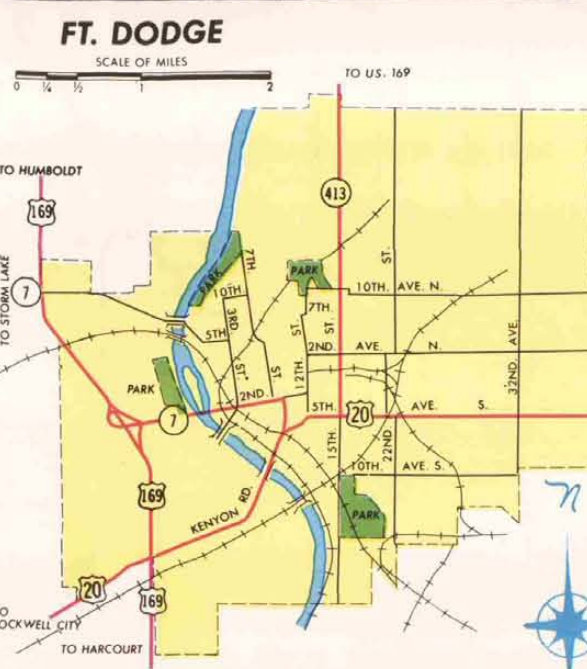

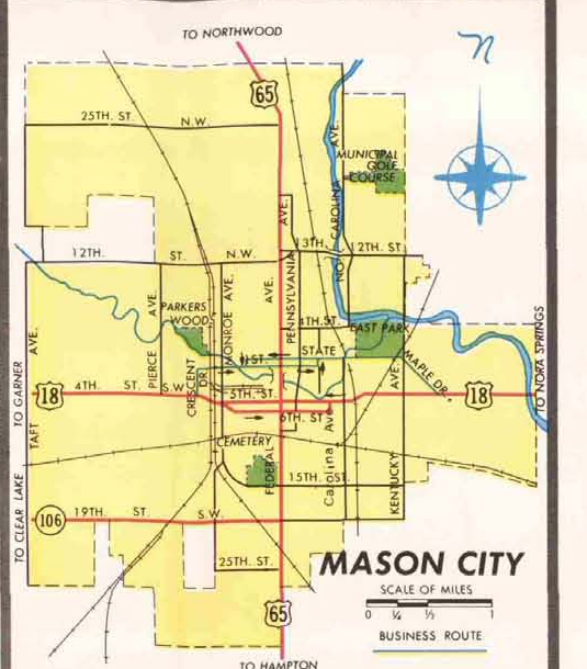
SIoux CITY

SCALE OF MILES

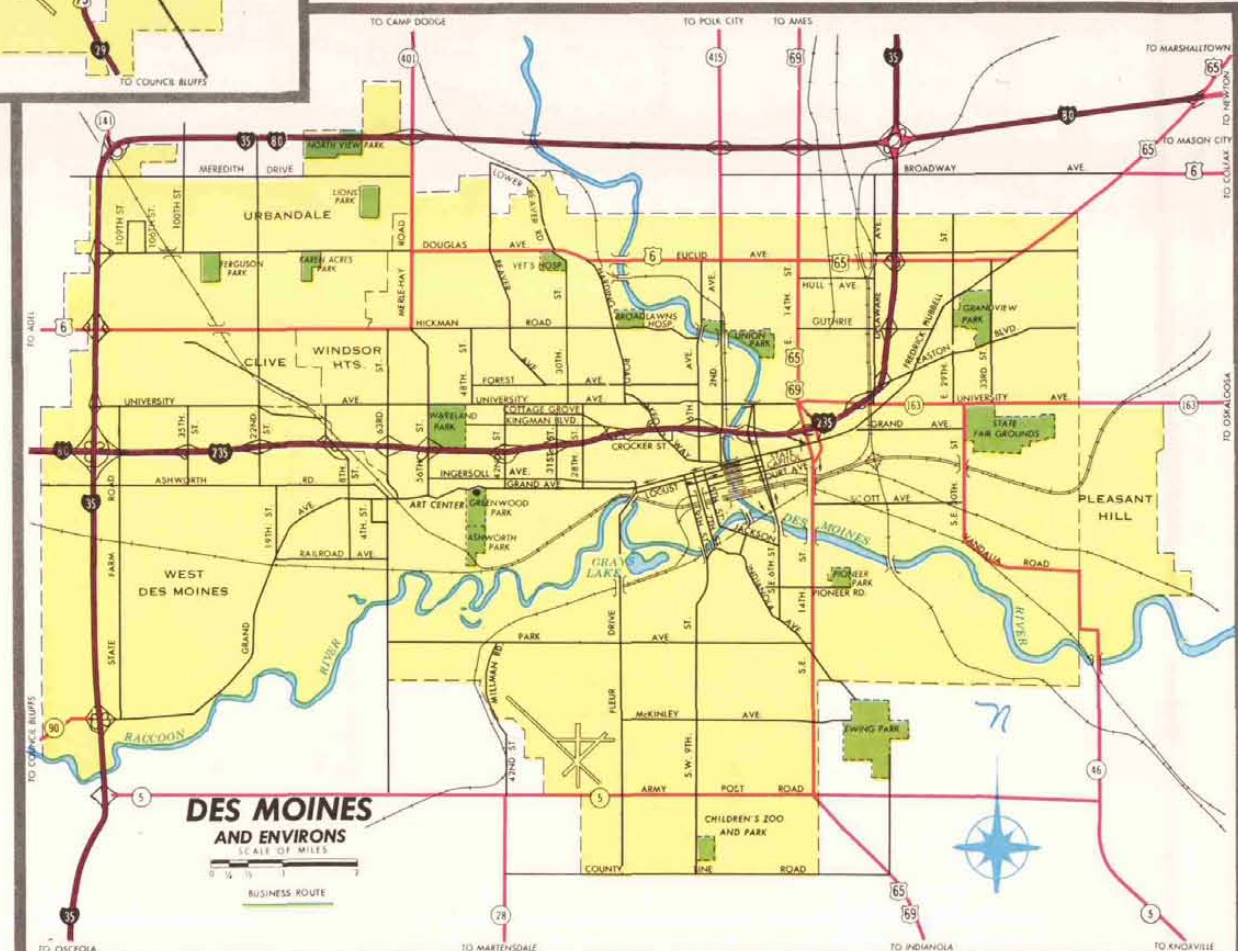


MASON CITY

SCALE OF MILES

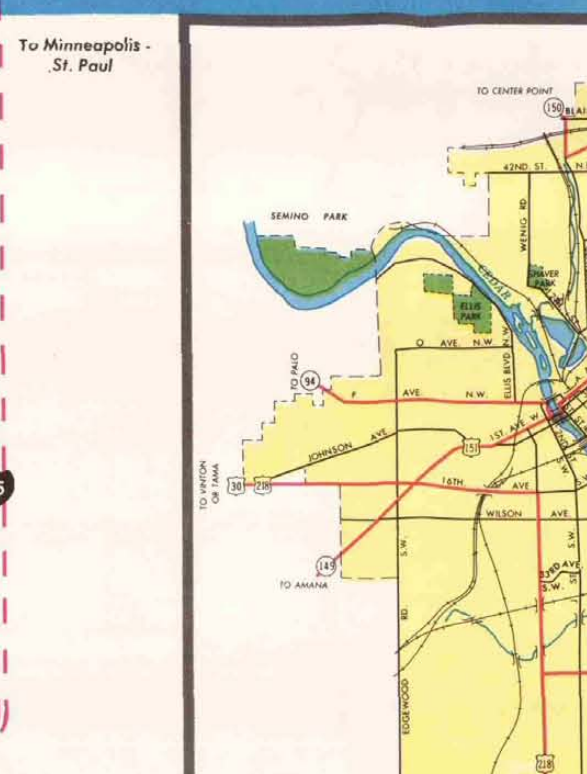
INTERSTATE LEGEND

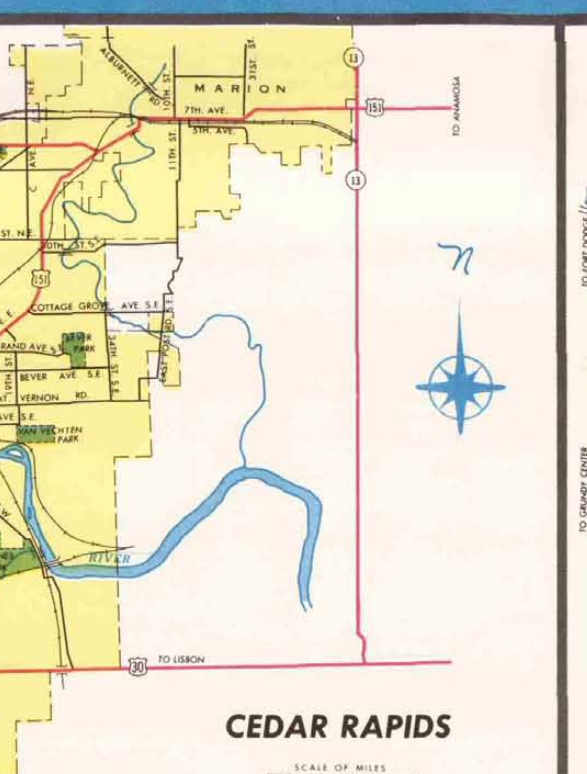
DES MOINES AND DIVISIONS
