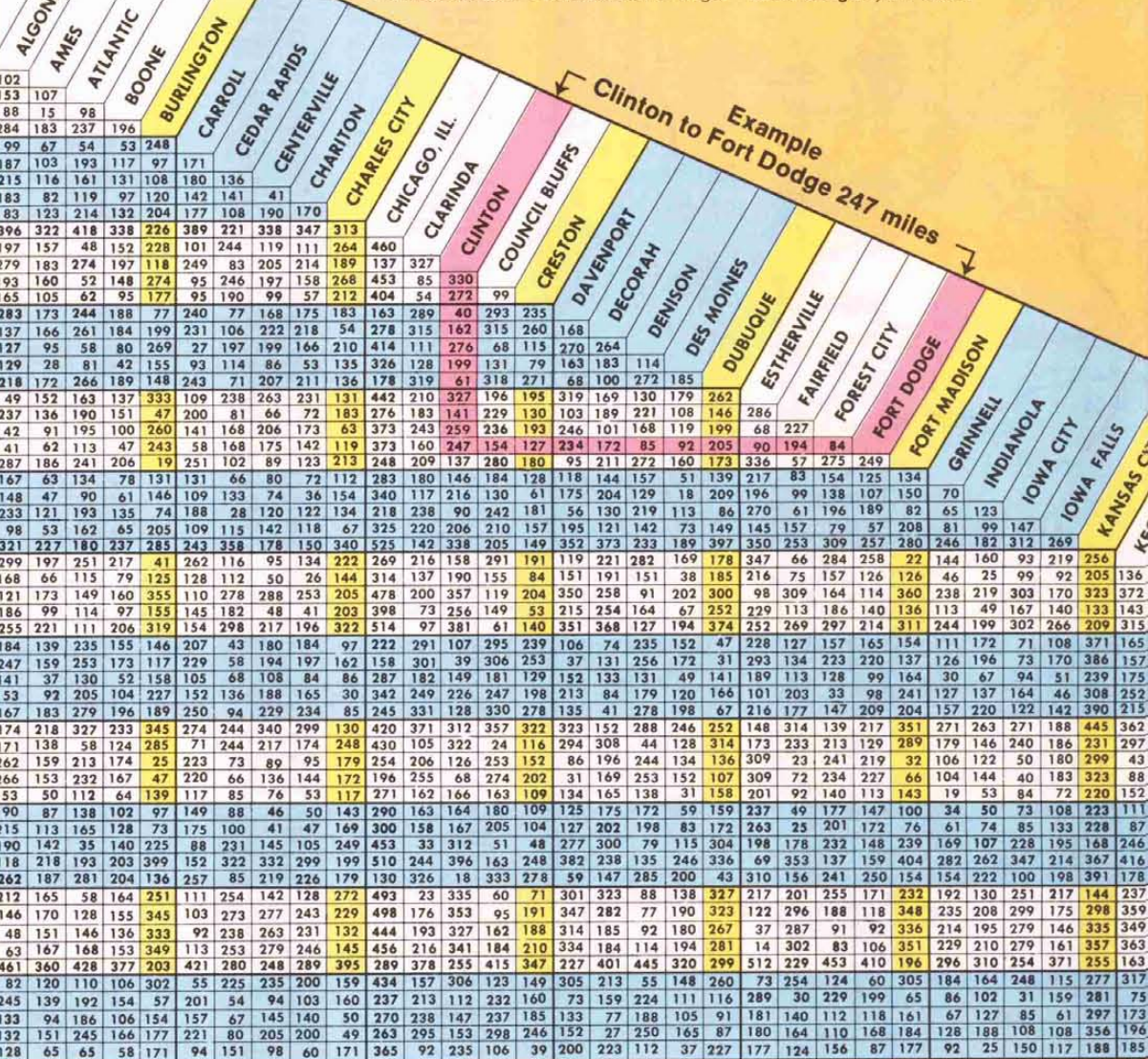

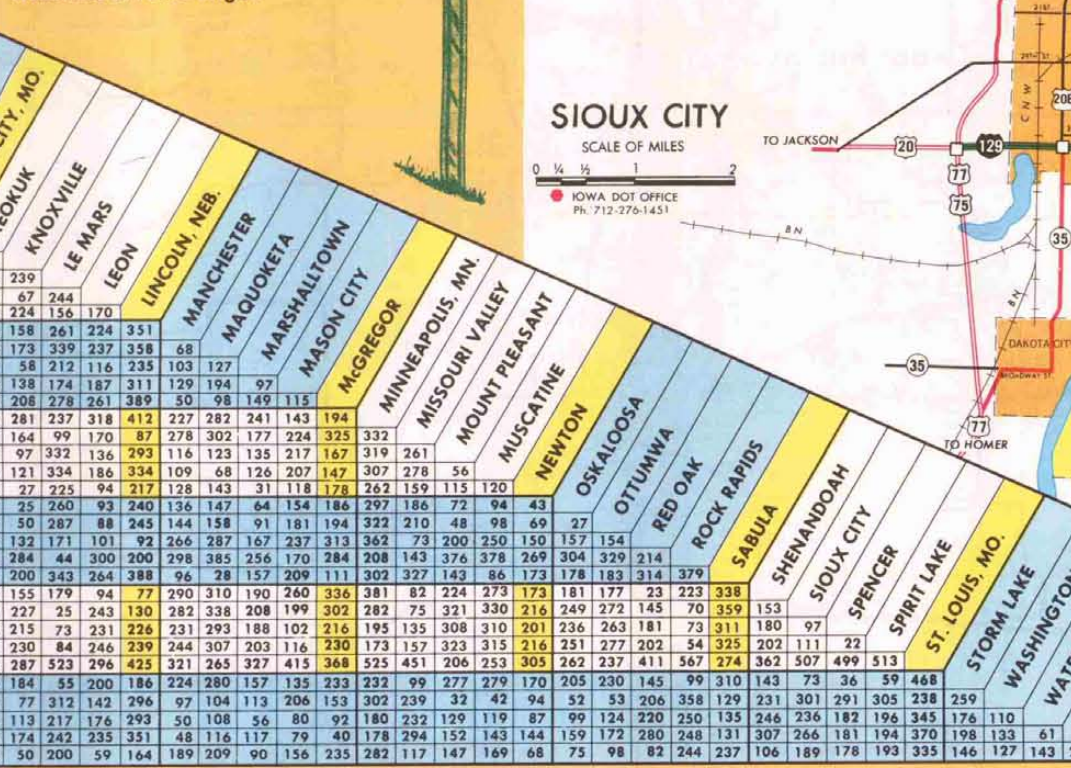

Mileposts, installed at on-mile intervals along Iowa's rural primary highways, aid motorists and traffic officers in accurately locating and reporting accidents or emergencies. The markers may also be used by motorists for trip reference. Iowa's Interstate interchanges are now referenced on the map by these mileposts. The milepost numbers begin at the south and west state line or route origin.
